Overview

Len Bridge Challenge Trophy

The Novice section will camp with the aid of an assigned leader and get as much help as they ask for. The winners of this section will be the most improved patrol.

St. George's Competition

The St. George's section is for experienced campers. The rules for these are stricter and are judged by a team of leaders with no help (other than for safety reasons).

Who can enter?

- Troops may enter more than one patrol.
- A patrol consists of a minimum of 4 and a maximum of 8 Scouts.
- No team member is to be aged over 14.
- A maximum per team of 1 PL and 2 APL's or 2 PL's and 1 APL.

If you do not have enough Scouts please enter those that wish to attend anyway as we can make up some composite teams. You must notify Richard of how many Scouts and Patrols you are entering at least a week BEFORE the event.

Visitors

All visitors including leaders should report to the judges once the competition has begun. No one will be allowed on sites unless a judge accompanies them.
